EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS) Burnihat, under the aegis of Directorate of Forest Education (DFE), Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, as part of its mandate to conduct refresher courses and theme-based training workshop for serving State Forest Service officers, Assistant Conservator of Forests and Forest Range officers from various State Forest Departments, Central Academy for State Forest Service, (CASFOS) Burnihat organized a one-week Training on “**Wildlife Management**” from 08th to 12th January, 2024. This theme-based training being held for In-service SFS officers and senior FROs was organized by the Academy. The training was conducted in physical mode. A total of **twenty-four (24)** nominations were received from the **Thirteen (13)** States/Union Territories. Out of which, **nineteen (19)** Participants from **Eleven (11)** States participated with overwhelming enthusiasm in this training programme.

The **Wildlife Management** module was developed with experts input on the subject, feedback of such earlier courses and in-house experience. The participants were asked to fill the online registration form provided by the Academy to confirm their participations. Thereafter, all the registered participants arrived on the 7th of January and attended the training sessions physically from 8th January onwards.

The Course was inaugurated by Honorable Shri. M. K. Yadava, IFS, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Head of Forest Force, Government of Assam as Chief Guest and Prof. Anil Kumar Dharni, IFS (Retd.), Former PCCF, Kerala as Guest of Honour. The Course Director, Shri Rahul M. Rohane, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, Burnihat welcomed the Chief Guest and the Participants formally to the training Programme. The Assistant Course Director, Dr. Ramkrishnan R, Scientist-C, for the training programme gave a brief presentation about aims and objectives of the Course. The chief Guest in his opening remarks, emphasized about such courses in regular intervals for the In-service officers so as to update the officers about new developments and aspects in the field of wildlife management. He explained the challenges for the forest officials in the field by giving example of Wildlife management in Kaziranga National Park. The Guest of Honor also emphasized about the importance of such knowledge building trainings to equip the officers with new developments and tools in the field of wildlife management. He explained with anecdotes about the need of learning from the failures of management.

The training programme was designed in such a way to impart the knowledge to the participating officers about different aspects of management in different areas of

wildlife. The resource persons delivered talks on the different subjects like Green Infrastructure to avoid Human Wildlife Conflicts by Prof. Anil Kumar Dharni, IFS (Retd.), Former PCCF, Kerala, Recent advances in Wildlife techniques, applications and achievements by Dr. Salvador Lyngdoh, Scientist-E, WII, Dehradun, Field based techniques in long term conservation and ecological perspectives by Shri. Shivaji Chavan, Director, Wildlife & We Protection Foundation, Wildlife Protection Amendment Act, 2022 by Mr. C. A. Rahman, IFS (Retd.), CTF, CASFOS, Burnihat, Social Media monitoring, network analysis by Dr. A. Pragatheesh, Wildlife Inspector of Regional Office, Guwahati, Immobilization and rescue of stray wild animals by Dr. K. K. Sarma, Padma Shri Awardee, Veterinarian & Professor of Surgery & Radiology, COVS, Guwahati, Control and management of Avian Influenza outbreak by Mr. Rahul M. Rohane, IFS, Principal, CASFOS, Burnihat, Management Effectiveness Evaluation by Mr. Md. Sajid Sultan, IFS, AIGF, NTCA, New Delhi, Application of IT in Intelligence gathering by Mr. Arjun Chettri, Assistant Director, North East Police Academy, Meghalaya, Application of GIS in Wildlife Management by Dr. Rocky Pebam, Scientist-F, North Eastern Space Applications Centre, Meghalaya, Community Participation in Wildlife Management by Mr. Bibhav Kumar Talukdar, Secretary General, Aaranyak, Guwahati and Investigation of Organized Crime by Mr. Rahul Dutta, Intelligence Specialist, International Rhino Foundation, NER- Tezpur as indicated in Annexure - 2 & 3.

The participants received the lecture sessions positively and had fruitful interaction with the resource persons through question-answers session and informally over tea breaks as well. All the Course materials were provided to the participants in the form of PowerPoint presentation in Pen Drives.

Besides the Lecture room sessions, the participants were given field exposure of practical management strategies adopted for Wildlife management in Kaziranga National Park by way of field visit on 11th and 12th January, 2024. During the field visit the participants were exposed to the management activities carried out by park authorities and interaction with the field staff. The ACF of KNP also gave a presentation on the management of KNP and had discussion with the participants. The participants were also given presentation on the activities carried out by the Centre for Wildlife Rehabilitation and Conservation by Dr. Rathin Barman, Joint Director, Wildlife Trust of India. The participants also visited the National Orchid Park managed by the community in Kaziranga. During the Valedictory Session the participants were addressed by the Field Director of Kaziranga National Park, Dr. Sonali Ghosh, IFS, followed by Certificate Distribution. During the interaction and feedback session, the participants expressed

their satisfaction with the overall design, schedule, planning and execution of the training - programme. Most of the participants reviewed the course as useful and suggested for its continuation in future at regular intervals to refresh their memories and to keep them abreast with the recent developments in the field of Wildlife Management. The overall feedback of the course and the resource persons is attached as Annexure - 4 & 5. The graphical analysis of feedback is attached as Annexure – 5. The List of participants is attached as Annexure – 6.

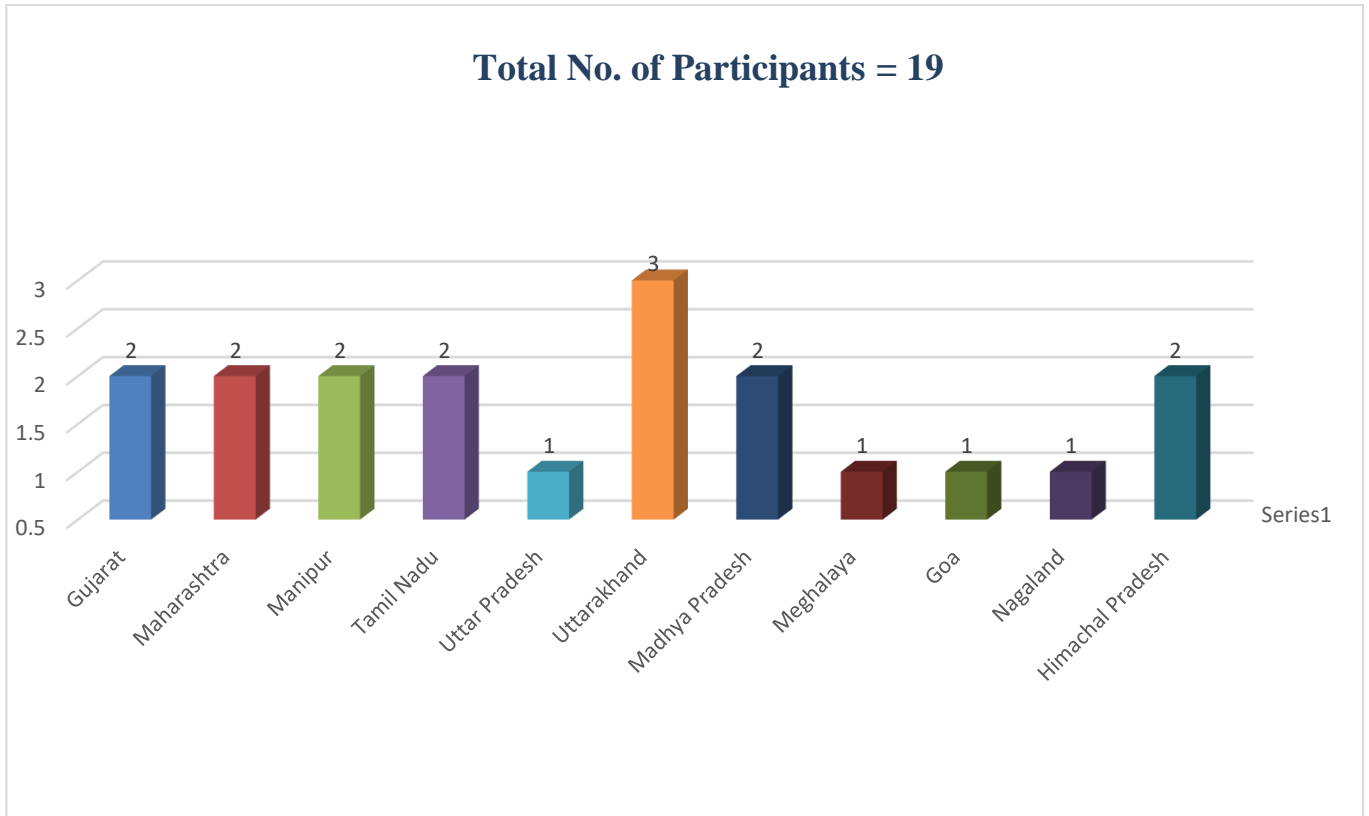

		assessed by them with rating of 94.74%. The contents of the course and reading material were found relevant and highly appreciated by participants by rating it with 96.05% and 93.42% respectively.
9.2	Training Resource Persons (TF)	The participants have overall rated the training resource persons at 95.68% . Training resource persons and their lectures were highly appreciated by the participants by rating the Contents of their deliberations, Presentation skill, Quality of discussion/interaction, the extent in meeting the objectives and the field visit were rated at 91.09%, 91.82%, 90.85%, 91.66% and 100% respectively.
9.3	Usefulness of the course (UOC)	The participants have given overall feedback that said that the training course will be highly useful by rating it 97.37% . It will be highly useful immediately and in future for their job with ratings of 97.37% and 97.37% respectively.

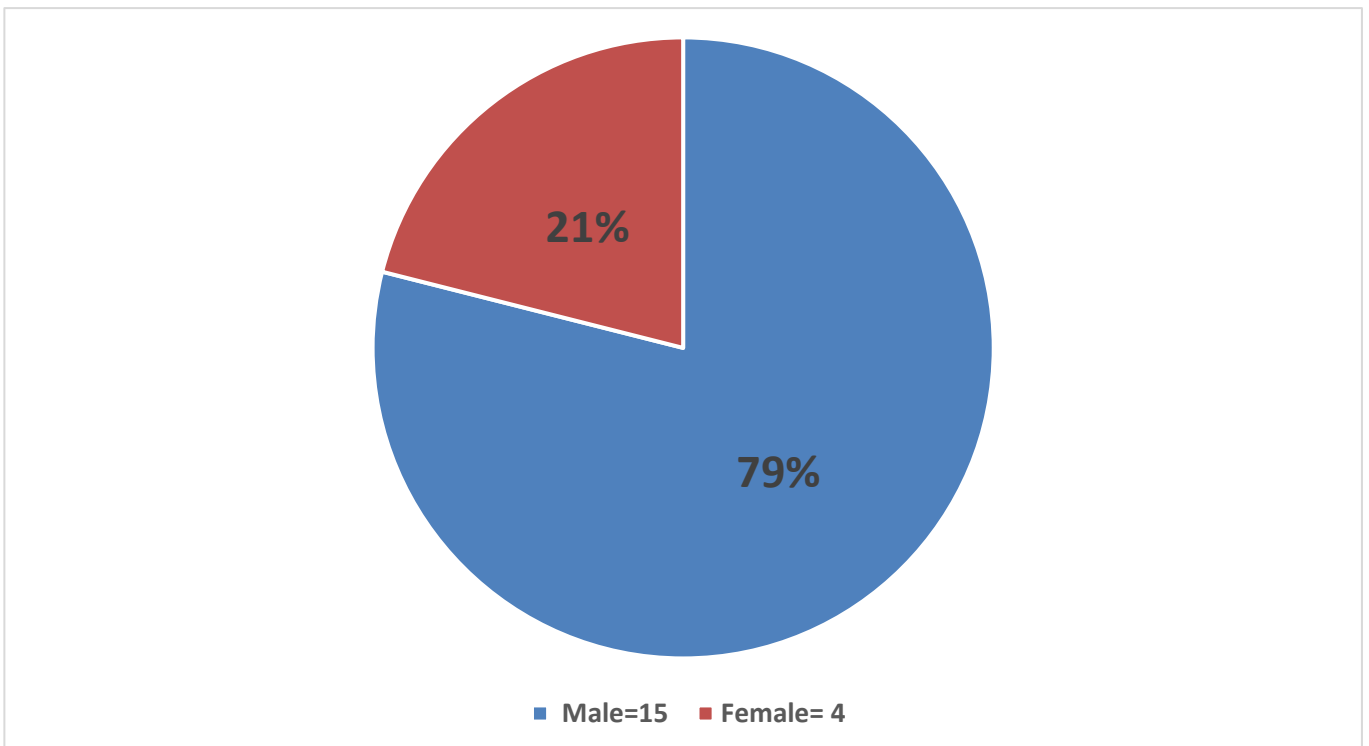
9.7	Weighted Average of the course	The weighted average of the course based on the feedback of the participants is 94.98% , which is excellent and satisfactory.

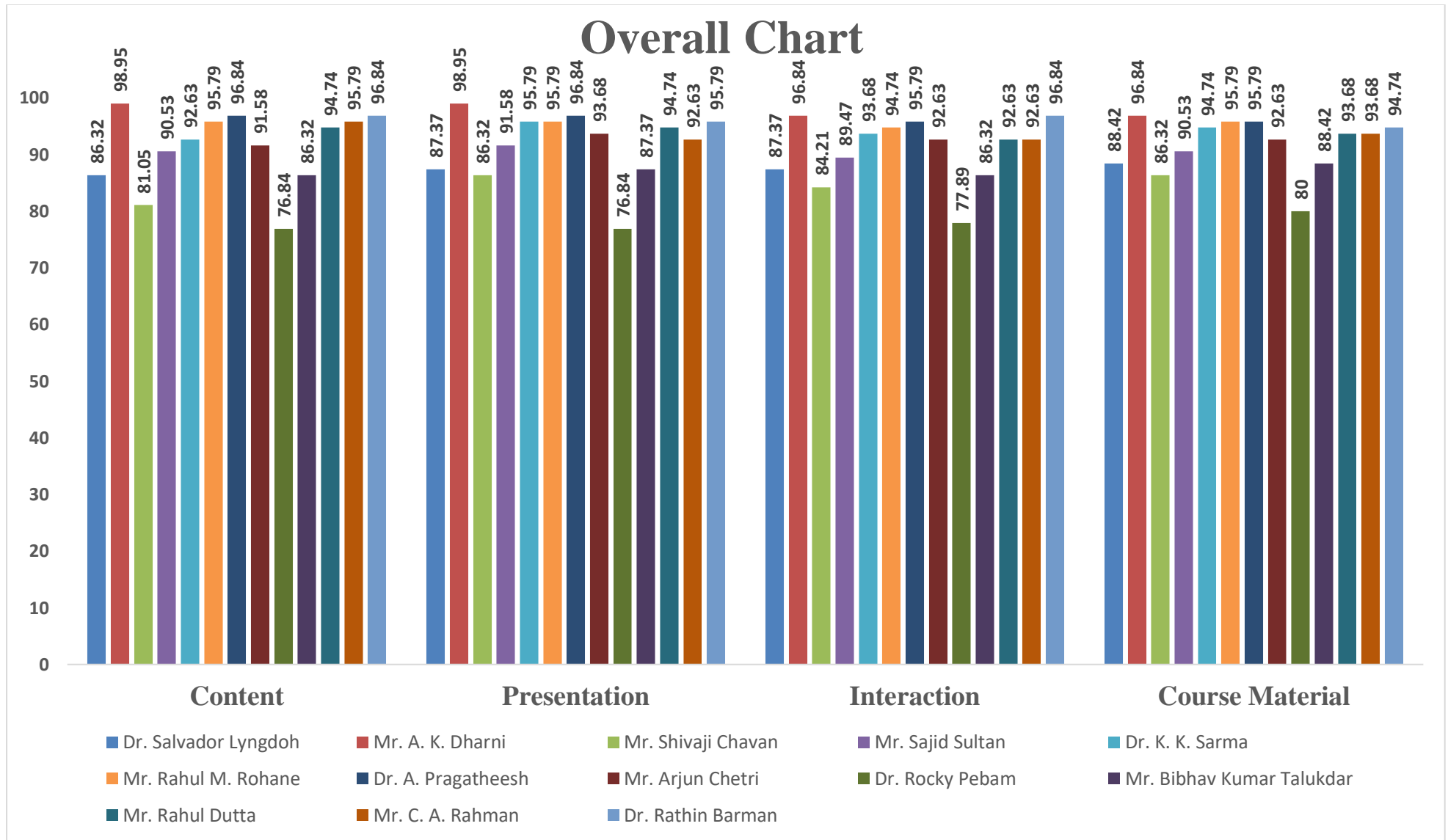

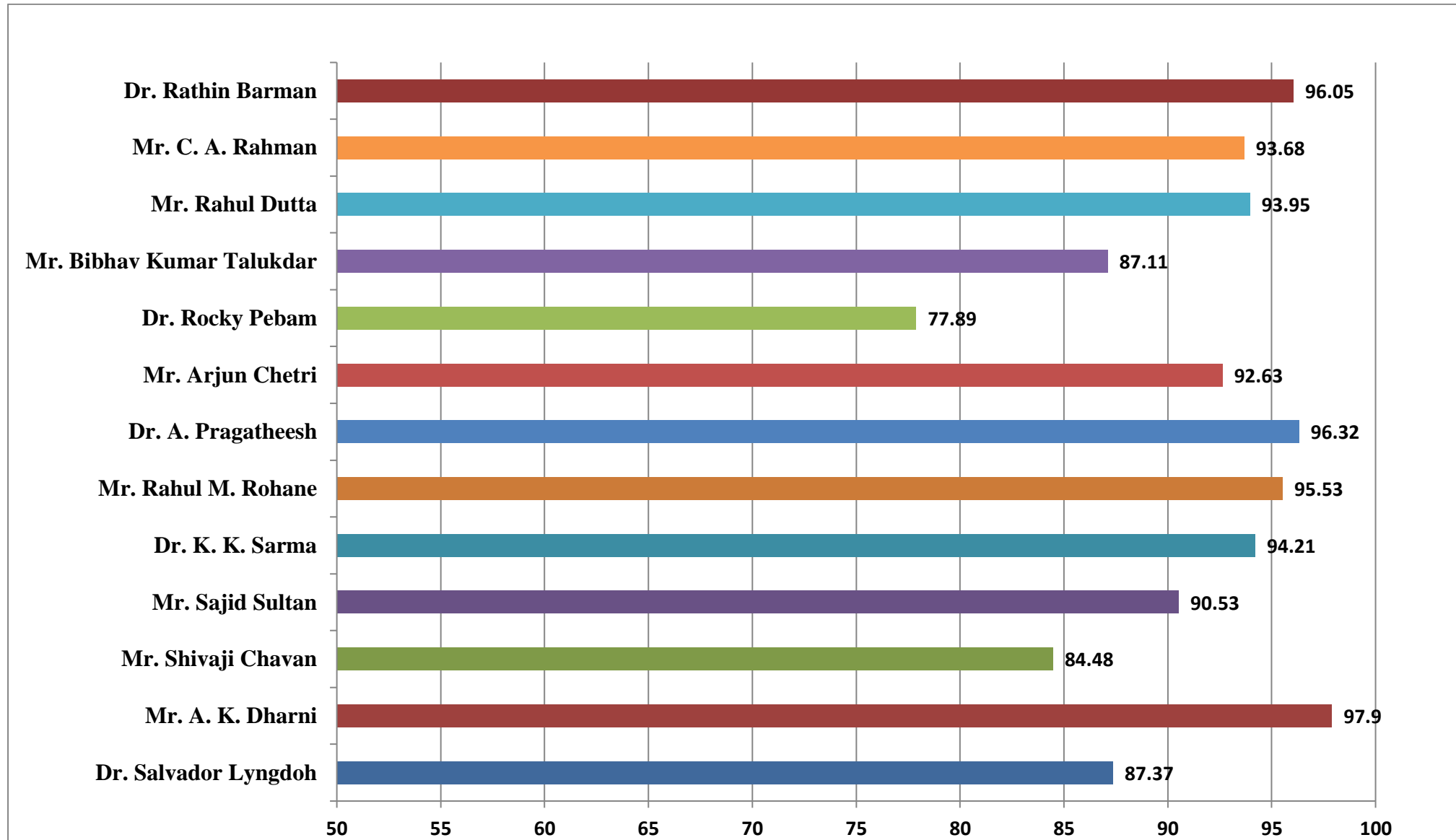

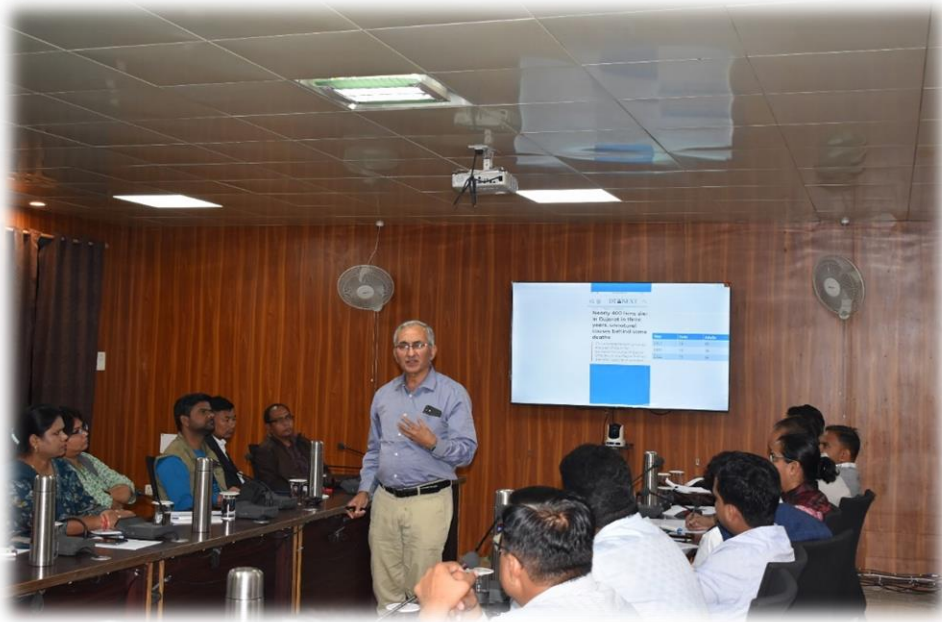
